COVID-19 Prevention Strategies for the 2020-2021 School Year

Masks/Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)



- Masks required for employees
- Masks strongly encouraged for students at school and expected for those riding a school bus
- Additional PPE in clinics and when serving medically fragile students

Enhanced Cleaning



- Improved routine cleaning and disinfecting of facilities by custodians
- Safe and effective cleaner provided to all teachers and office staff to use on high-touch surfaces throughout the day

Wellness and Hygiene



- Hand sanitizing stations installed in school hallways
- Hand-washing and sanitizing encouraged throughout the day
- Paper towel dispensers installed in bathrooms
- Restricted use of water fountains/ encouraged use of water bottles

Bus Safety



- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for bus drivers, including masks and gloves
- Assigned student seating to improve loading and unloading
- Buses disinfected after morning and afternoon routes
- Sanitizing station affixed to the bus frame
- All students are expected to wear masks
- Parents may choose to transport their child to school

Class Structures

- Classrooms used for instruction will follow all social distancing protocols. Student desks will be 6 feet apart, or 4.5 feet if 6 feet is not possible.
- The classrooms selected will be able to accommodate 9-13 students.

School Logistics



- Space out desks and tables in classrooms to improve social distancing
- Limited distribution of school lockers and building visitors will be restricted
- "Mask Down Zones" in classrooms where students can safely, but temporarily, remove masks
- Hybrid learning will take place to accommodate in person and remote learning instruction.

Health Services



- All persons who are sick will be expected to stay at home
- Those who become sick at school or work will be sent home immediately
- Students reporting to the clinic will have their temperature taken
- The school will have a room to isolate symptomatic persons

Public Health Signage

- CDC-designed signage displayed prominently throughout buildings to reinforce healthy hygiene and expected school and workplace behaviors
- Health information posted on how to prevent the spread of COVID-19
- Instruction related to COVID-19 will be provided to all stakeholders through mass messengers and will be posted on the school website.



Student Meals

- Students will eat in their classrooms, those eating in the cafeteria will be seated in a manner that supports social distancing
- Lunch schedules will be modified to ensure social distancing.
- Students will be required to wash their hands before and after eating. Students will be instructed to wash their hands two at a time to comply with social distancing.

Plan to Reopen

The following reopening plan has been designed to ensure the safety of all our students, staff, parents and community members. The global pandemic has forced educators to redesign the education system to cater to the needs of students in a manner that the world has never seen before. In order to ensure that the education of all our students is not compromised and students are prepared for the challenges of the 21st century we have outlined a plan that will allow for instruction to occur in a meaningful and productive manner. The following protocols have been designed to ensure that the right to an education is not denied to any of our students and all guidelines took into consideration the regulations as set forth by the Department of Health.

COVID-19 is mostly spread by respiratory droplets released when people talk, cough, or sneeze. It is thought that the virus may spread to hands from a contaminated surface and then to the nose or mouth, causing infection. Therefore, personal prevention practices (such as hand washing, staying home when sick) and environmental cleaning and disinfection are important principles that are covered in this document. Fortunately, there are a number of actions school administrators can take to help lower the risk of COVID-19 exposure and spread during school sessions and activities.

General guidelines:

- All staff will be provided training and guidelines on proper hygiene and sanitary procedures that need to be followed in light of the Coronavirus pandemic.
- Information regarding steps to take to prevent the spread of Covid-19 will be widely circulated using all avenues of mass communication. In order to create awareness of all the protocols that need to be followed our school will have in person/zoom meetings, phone conversations, a set of written guidelines for all members of the school, Covid-19 information pamphlets, signs/posters in schools, and information on how to successfully carry on with school in light of the pandemic will be posted on the school website and sent through a mass messenger system.
- Administrators will review with staff/parents' proper sanitary measures that need to be carried out at home and in school in relation to the Coronavirus.
- Staff/Parents will be trained, and letters will be sent home with regard to the warning signs that need to be taken seriously and the steps that will be necessary to ensure the safety of all.
- Staff will be trained to go over procedures with students regarding proper hand and respiratory hygiene, face coverings and social distancing. Teachers will establish procedures and protocols to maintain a clean atmosphere in the classroom and create guidelines for students to follow to maintain proper hygiene.
- School buses will be required to be properly sanitized and disinfected. Bus drivers should follow all protocols as set forth by the Transportation department. Bus drivers should wear masks and gloves whenever feasible.
- Students using the bus for transportation will be asked to enter the school one

at a time and they should maintain 6 feet distance to the best of their ability.

- The school railing leading to the entrance of the school will be marked off by 6 feet distance in order to have a spot for each student as they leave the bus and wait to be escorted by the teacher to enter the school.
- Students will be required to wear masks as they enter the school building.
- Parents dropping off their children will be asked to use the back entrance. Staff will be stationed by the back entrance to monitor students as they enter the building and ensure all safety measures are being followed. Parents will be required to drop off their children and will not be allowed inside the school building during arrival and dismissal time.
- Staff will be stationed at different entry points to ensure that students are wearing masks and check for any concerning health problems in students.
- Arrival/Dismissal time will vary according to grade to avoid overcrowding of any entrance/exit.

Face Coverings

- All staff, students, parents and any visitors entering the building will be required to wear face coverings at all times, especially when in situations where appropriate social distancing is not possible. Students will be allowed to move face covering during mealtime, instruction and for short breaks. Any area where 6ft distance is not practical, students will be required to wear masks.
- Masks- The school will have disposable masks available for students, parents and teachers in order to ensure that face coverings are accessible at all times.
- Exemptions- Any student or staff that has a medical excuse and cannot wear a mask always will be excused however they must follow social distancing rules.
- Enforcement: School administration or staff will be consistently monitoring that students take face coverings seriously. In instances where reusable masks are left at home, a disposable mask will be provided for the day. Students who repeatedly do not wear a mask on school grounds will be educated on their importance while faculty will work to use restorative practices to encourage students to utilize a mask.
- Social Distancing- Students will be placed in classrooms with proper circulation of air and ventilation. The classrooms will space out all desks to maintain 6 feet distance between students and the teacher. The use of Air filters and air conditioners, and opening of windows will allow for proper circulation of air.

Classroom Structure (Hybrid Instruction)

- Classrooms used for instruction will attempt to maintain social distancing as much as possible. The schedule has been arranged such that different grades will be in the building on alternate days to allow for maximum social distancing.
- Grades 1-6 will be in person 3 days a week and remote 2 days. Certain students depending upon circumstances will be allowed in person 5 days

- Grades KG will be in person 5 days.
 - 7-12 grades will be in person Monday-Thursday and remote Friday.
- The following table shows grades that are in person and remote

:

- Teachers will be encouraged to use digital instruction as much as possible to limit the number of supplies and books required in the classroom and control the spread of germs.
- Students/Staff will be encouraged to take hand-washing breaks throughout the day, in addition to washing hands before and after eating, as well as before sharing materials. Hand soap and paper towels will be provided at every sink. Hand sanitizer will be in each classroom. We will encourage all parents to purchase hand sanitizers such that students have access to them at all times.
- Teachers will minimize the use of shared items in the classroom, including learning tools, pencils and other items shared in a group setting. If any group activities occur, students shall wear masks.
- Students will remain in the same classroom all day and teachers will be required to move from class to class in order to provide instruction.
- Teachers will utilize in person learning to teach concepts that are difficult for students to work on remotely and use the time to teach new material as required by the curriculum.

Meal time

- Administrators/teachers will go over all protocols students need to comply with during breakfast and lunch time.
- Administrators/Teachers will educate students and post signs on proper procedures to follow while eating and disposal of trash procedures.
- Students will be provided with breakfast and lunch in the classroom. Students will eat in the classroom.
- Students will be encouraged to use hand sanitizer/wash hands before eating.
- Students will not be allowed to pass or share any items, including food, with other students.
- Teachers and staff will facilitate lunch and breakfast procedures.

- Custodial staff will create a schedule to clean tables and classrooms throughout the day.. Custodians will establish sanitation procedures to clean and disinfect tables, chairs, and other frequently touched hard surfaces between groups of students.
- Students will be reminded that the expectation is to wear face covering up to the point of beginning their meal and immediately upon finishing the face cover will be put back on.

Transportation

- School administration along with the bus driver will establish seating charts in order to ensure social distancing.
- There will only be one student allowed in each seat on the bus.
- Students will be socially distanced as much as the physical capacity of the bus allows.
- Hand sanitizer stations will be on each bus, and students will be encouraged to use it upon entry and exit.
- Students will also wear masks while maintaining social distance.
- Bus drivers will have disposable masks to hand out to students in the event a student does not have his or her mask.
- Ventilation will be incorporated into the bus along with air conditioning systems.
- Bus cleanings will be required every day and if possible twice a day

Access Control

- All visitors will always be required to wear a facemask
- All visitors will be encouraged to set an appointment prior to their visit
- Administrators will prioritize meetings over the phone or virtually to avoid in person meetings
- School administration will establish a wait line system for offices and visitors where inadequate barrier systems might exist. This system should be limited to 2-3 people at a time with socially distancing strictly enforced.

Sanitation Cleaning and Disinfecting Protocols

- All areas in the school will be cleaned and sanitized on a daily basis.

- Custodial staff will wear face masks and gloves as much as possible. Provide appropriate gear for cleaning to staff.
- All staff and students will be provided with guidelines on how to work together to keep the school clean at all times.
- Hand sanitizers and disinfectant sprays will be made readily available to all staff and students to maintain cleaning of all areas.
- Night custodial shifts will be required to clean all areas, sanitize and disinfect such that all classrooms, restrooms, offices and hallways are ready to use for the next day.
- Cleaning will be focused on high-touch surfaces and objects vary by location. Examples include doorknobs, light switches, handrails, kitchen appliances, countertops, drawer handles, tables, sinks, faucet and toilet handles, drinking fountains, elevator buttons, push and pull plates on doors, phones, keys and remotecontrols.
- Clean surfaces with soap or detergent and water (or a cleaning product) first to remove visible dirt and grime. Disinfectants are most effective on clean surfaces and objects.
- Alcohol-based Hand-Rub Dispensers will be placed in each classroom and hallways.

Prekindergarten

Prekindergarten program will follow all guidelines set forth by the New York State Department of Health when planning for 2020-2021 Prekindergarten programming. The following health and safety guidance that will be also be considered:

- Family style eating will not be practiced, due to health and safety requirements.
- Since our classroom does not have an interior bathroom, an adult will accompany each child to and from the bathroom outside the classroom and ensure that proper handwashing protocols are followed.
- Napping materials will be sanitized daily, to the extent that its practicable.
- Center-based and small group learning is a critical component of a Prekindergarten instructional program. Our School will:

- avoid centers that include multiple students using it at one time, such as water/sand tables, sensory table, dramatic play etc.
- students will have individual sets of materials to avoid sharing of common items; and we will follow proper sanitation guidelines from the Department of Health after children have been at a learning center or in small groups.

Gatherings in school

- All indoor gatherings in school will be limited to 50-60 individuals in any designated area depending upon space.
- All gatherings must follow social distancing protocols and all individuals present must have face covering on at all times.
- Whenever possible, preference will be given to virtual meetings with any given party.

Screenings

We will do the following daily:

- Prior to entering the school building all staff/parents/students will be asked to do a self-evaluation. Parents will be asked to look for the following signs and not send their child to school if one of these is visible:
- Have you experienced any of these symptoms, not associated with previously diagnosed conditions, in the past 72 hours:
 - ~ **Fever greater than 100.4F/chills**
 - ~ **Cough/shortness of breath**
 - ~ **New loss of taste or smell**
 - ~ **Nausea/vomiting/diarrhea**
- In the last 14 days, have you:
 - ~ Been in close contact with anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19
 - ~ Been placed on quarantine for possible contact with COVID-19
 - ~ Traveled abroad to an area of the country where it is recommended that you self-quarantine
 - ~ Have a COVID-19 test pending
- If a student/parent/staff member answers yes to any of the above, we will ask them to stay home and only return either with a doctor's note or after 14 days of quarantine.

- Office staff will check all students' temperatures on a daily basis upon entering the building. Any student with a temperature above 100 will be placed in a separate classroom and their parents will be immediately notified to pick up their child.
- Any child exhibiting any symptoms related to Covid 19 will be isolated and sent home. Teachers will be trained to monitor students for Covid related symptoms.
- Records will be kept on every student that is sent home due to symptoms related to Covid 19. Students will only be allowed to return to school once they are cleared by a doctor or they have spent 72 hours with no symptoms.
- Vulnerable populations- If a staff member or student has underlying health issues we will accommodate accordingly.

- **Attendance**

- Teachers will collect and report daily teacher/student engagement or attendance for Prekindergarten through 12th grade, regardless of the instructional setting.
- Attendance will be taken for every period of class not

only homeroom. Mental Health, Behavioral, and Emotional

Support Services and Programs-

- We will provide ongoing support to our students through reinforcing a positive culture during remote and hybrid learning. Sessions on mental health will be held periodically. All stakeholders will work to use the data collected to help develop plans to address the areas of concern.
 - Award systems will be in place to encourage students.
 - Online competitions will take place to help students in their skill building

Teaching and Learning

- **The school will provide 180 days, or the equivalent, of instruction to their students.**
- **Google Classroom: Teachers must use google classroom for each of their classes. All assignments from teachers, assignment submissions from students, and lesson plans must be exchanged via Google Classroom.**
 - **All teachers are required to conduct Zoom sessions everyday to increase student engagement.**
 - **Classes will run on a 40 minute block schedule and students learning remotely will be expected to logon to their classrooms using zoom.**

Classes will be live streamed for students that are viewing from home on remote days.

- **Hallways:** All students must walk on the right side of hallways to prevent close contact. There will be markers on the walls/floors to make it easier for the children
- **Stairs:** Rear stairs are only for going up while the stairs near the office and the side stairs are only for going down.
- **Separate Entrances:** Once classrooms are determined, students whose classrooms are near the front of the school must enter via the front and vice versa.
- **Water/Bathroom Breaks:** Teacher must check the hallway first to ensure that it's empty. If empty, the child can proceed to drink water/go to the bathroom. If the bathroom has two students in it, the child must return to class and wait.
- **Remote to Hybrid:** Students who would like to transition from remote to hybrid must do so before the 1st of any given month. Then, by the 7th of any given month, all parents who requested hybrid learning will be integrated into the classrooms.

Protocols for Remote Learning

- **All students are expected to login to the zoom link provided by the teacher at the assigned time of class.**
- **Students' remote learning times will be the same as school timing. Teachers will provide login links and each subject class is expected to run live 40 minutes.**
- **Students are expected to attend their sessions online on time and prepared with supplies that are required for class.**
- **Students must be attentive in class and stay away from all distractions.**
- **Failure to follow instructions will lead to disciplinary action.**
- **All students are expected to complete all classwork and homework assignments.**
- **Students will receive grades for at least two assignments each week.**
- **It is the responsibility of the student to stay on task and complete all assignments.**
- **Actively participate in class discussions.**
- **While class is in session students are required to be on task.**
- **Cameras on at all times**
- **During class students should not be distracting, talking or searching the net.**

Operational Requirements:

- Nonpublic Schools must ensure that testing will follow the testing policy currently within public schools for frequency and volume (currently, 10% of eligible, unvaccinated students are tested biweekly). The testing frequency and volume will be audited and validated after each testing day.
 - As with DOE COVID-19 testing policy, only unvaccinated students in grades 1-12 are eligible for testing.
- Nonpublic Schools must provide the Office of Nonpublic Schools (ONPS) with monthly counts of all students whose vaccination status is known. ONPS will provide a date and a method by which the data should be shared. Without this information, testing cannot be conducted.
 - Nonpublic Schools will be responsible for ensuring proper patient flow to the testing room. The provider will direct the testing process patient flow.

COVID Related information:

All staff and students above 12 are highly encouraged to get vaccinated.
All individuals that are not vaccinated (Students & Staff) will have to go through the testing requirements as mandated by

the school.

Stay home if sick: Often mild symptoms such as a runny nose or backache are mistaken for other illnesses and have turned out to be COVID-19. Encourage students, parents and guardians, faculty, and other staff to do the following:

- Monitor both your own and students' health and stay home if sick (even if your symptoms are mild), or have recently tested positive for COVID-19.
- Call the school to report any illness or positive test results for COVID-19.
- Isolate for at least 10 days after they first begin to have illness. Children cannot have contact with other children during this period (no play dates!).

Practice healthy hand hygiene:

Wash your hands often with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available; clean frequently touched surfaces regularly; avoid touching your face with unwashed hands; and cover your cough or sneeze with your arm, not your hands.

Students and staff must complete a health testing questionnaire prior to attending school

Handling a Case of COVID-19 in Your School Community

When is a person considered contagious:

- The infectious period is when someone with COVID-19 may potentially spread the virus to others (when they are contagious).
 - The start date of the infectious period is two days before the person had their first symptom or two days before their COVID-19 test date if they did not have symptoms.
 - The end date of the infectious period is 10 days after the person had their first symptom or 10 days after their COVID-19 test date if they did not have symptoms.
 - The test date is the date when the sample for the test was taken, not the date when the test results were reported to the provider or patient.
- In school settings, a close contact is someone who has been within 6 feet for 10 or more minutes over a 24-hour period of someone who has COVID-19 during their infectious period, regardless of face mask use or the presence of plexiglass or other barriers.

Exception: Per CDC guidance, in the classroom setting, students sitting 3 to 6 feet from a student with COVID-19 do not need to quarantine if they and the student with COVID-19 wore masks correctly and consistently. This exception applies only to students and not to staff.

○ Other people may be considered close contacts in certain situations, such as when physical distancing cannot be consistently monitored or maintained (such as on the school bus, younger children who are unable to remain 6 feet apart and wear masks, and during some sports and recreational activities).

Student Shows Symptoms of COVID-19 While at School

When a student has symptoms of COVID-19 during the school day:

1. A student showing one or more symptoms of COVID-19 (including fever of 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, chills, new cough, new loss of taste or smell, and/or new shortness of breath) should go to or be escorted by a staff member wearing a wellfitting mask over their

nose and mouth to the designated area.

2. The area or classroom where the student was showing symptoms must be cleaned and disinfected as soon as possible.
3. The school calls the student’s parent or guardian for pick up.
4. Upon arrival of the student’s parent or guardian, a staff member escorts the student to the entrance for pick-up, advises the student to visit a health care provider and get tested for COVID-19, and provides information on the closest testing site.
5. The student can return to school when they fulfill the criteria for returning to school (see table below).

Criteria for Returning to School After Showing Symptoms (Not for Close Contacts)

The table below outlines the criteria for returning to school for any individual not identified as a close contact (student or staff) showing symptoms of COVID-19:

*A lab-based molecular test (PCR) is required to rule out COVID-19 if a person is symptomatic.

Self-Reported Positive Case

Any student or staff member who reports that they have tested positive for COVID-19 while at

School-Based Staff Member Shows Symptoms of COVID-19 While at School

Schools should follow the steps below when a staff member shows symptoms of COVID-19 during the school day:

1. The staff member immediately notifies the principal that they are not feeling well and are experiencing COVID-like symptoms.
2. The school will advise the staff member to get tested for COVID-19 as soon as possible and provides information of the closest testing site. The staff member must go home.
 - a. If the staff member needs to wait for transportation assistance, the staff member should leave the building, stay somewhere away from others and wear a face mask.

- b. The area or classroom where the staff member was showing symptoms must be cleaned and disinfected as soon as possible.
- c. The staff member can return to school when they fulfill one of the criteria for returning to school (see table below).

3. If the staff member was vaccinated against COVID-19 within the past three days, the staff member may be experiencing post-vaccine symptoms such as fatigue, fever, headache and/or chills. The staff member must go home and can return to work if symptoms resolve within two days (see table below).

Quarantine of a classroom or specific students

There may be times when your child is asked to quarantine due to exposure to COVID-19. Here are the quarantine protocols for students:

- Elementary Schools: In the event there is a positive case in a classroom, all students in the class will be instructed to quarantine for 10 calendar days. Students will continue to receive live remote instruction while they quarantine.
- Middle and High Schools: In the event there is a positive case in a classroom, students who are:
 - At least 12 years old, vaccinated, and not showing symptoms will continue to attend school in-person. Out of an abundance of caution, these students are encouraged to take a COVID-19 test 3 to 5 days after exposure.
 - At least 12 years old, vaccinated, and showing symptoms will be directed to quarantine for 10 calendar days. These students will have access to remote learning while quarantining.
 - Unvaccinated will be directed to quarantine for 10 calendar days. These students will continue their learning remotely. On day 5 of their quarantine, students may take a COVID-19 test, and with a negative result, return to attending school in-person after day seven.

A person who has completed isolation or quarantine does not need a doctor's note, a note from the NYC Health Department or a negative laboratory test result to return to school. It is strongly recommended not to require negative COVID-19 test results after isolation, as a person may test positive for COVID-19 for many weeks or months after infection even though they are no longer contagious.

- Contacts of someone in quarantine do not need to stay home unless the quarantined person develops symptoms of COVID-19 or tests positive for COVID-19 (becomes a case).
- Quarantine is not required following domestic or international travel. All travelers, domestic and international, should follow all CDC travel requirements and recommendations. While quarantine is not required, schools can implement more restrictive requirements (for example, mandate that staff not return to work for a defined period of time after travel).
- Schools should work with bus companies to arrange for assigned seating on buses, to facilitate identifying close contacts. If a person with confirmed COVID-19 rode in or drove a school bus during their infectious period, all children and staff who were close contacts on the bus with that person will need to quarantine for 10 days. If it is not possible to identify close contacts, everyone must quarantine even if they were following physical distancing, wearing masks and taking other precautions.

General Safety of School

The school will follow all guidance related to health and safety. This will include meeting social distancing requirements and cleaning frequently touched spaces regularly to prevent spread of infection. We will follow the NYSED Reopening Guidance.

Fire Code Compliance

In case of emergency all protocols for fire safety and lockdowns will be followed.

The school will conduct standard operations and procedures to the best of their abilities without deviating from current requirements.

Fire (evacuation) Drills and Lockdown Drills will comply with plans as outlined by the fire department and will comply with social distancing rules.

The school building will comply with the requirements of the 2020 New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code (BC), except as specified in 19 NYCRR 1221.2(d).
